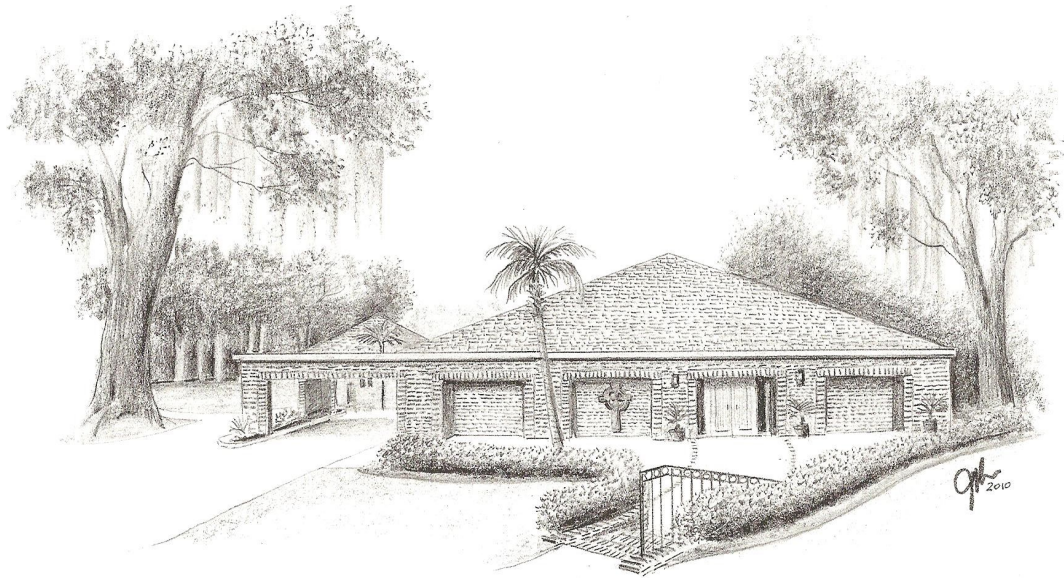

PRELUDE

WELCOME AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

INTERLUDE

*CALL TO WORSHIP (Taken from Isaiah 40:3-5)

Leader: A voice cries out: “In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God.

People: Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain.

All: Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.”

*OPENING PRAYER

CALL TO CONFESSION

PRAYER OF CONFESSION (We confess our sins aloud together, then in silence.)

Holy God, we are called to cry out from the wilderness, but sometimes we have trouble seeing past the forest and the trees. We are called to prepare the way of the Lord, but we have trouble finding our way because we choose to go our own way. We are called to make straight a path for our God, but we are crooked, and twisted, and messed up in every way possible. Forgive us for all of our crooked ways and for not living up to our calling. Pour out your grace upon us, that we may be forgiven, and others may see your love within us and your glory in Christ revealed.
